You will receive information on how to schedule your move-in time so be on the lookout in your NMSU email account. Move-in appointments will be for one-hour time periods and you'll need to present your Aggie ID card/Mobile ID in order to check in.

## BRINGING A VEHICLE?

If you plan to bring a vehicle to campus, you will need a parking permit to park in the lots near your Residence Hall. There are also free parking lots on the perimeter of campus. Please refer to the [parking map](#) to know where to park.

Parking permits can only be purchased online at <https://park.nmsu.edu/online/>. Be sure to choose the correct permit for the area in which you are assigned to. Select the "Resident Student Fall 2022" permit if you are living in RGH, Juniper Hall, Garcia Hall, Piñon Hall or Chamisa Village. Select the "Resident Family Housing Fall 2022" if you are living in Cervantes Village, Vista Del Monte, Tom Fort or Sutherland.

All permits will be mailed. Once logged into the parking portal click "Manage Account" and verify your mailing address is correct to prevent a delay in receiving your permit. If the address is incorrect, click 'Edit' and once saved remove any old addresses.

To prevent receiving a citation, you will need to print the temporary permit and display in left lower corner of your windshield. The permit receipt is good for three weeks. For additional questions, please email [parking@nmsu.edu](mailto:parking@nmsu.edu).

### First-Year Walk

Each fall, first-year Aggies are invited to start their college career with one of our favorite traditions: the First Year Walk. Students gather at the Pan American Center and walk through campus led by the Dean of Students and the student body President. Along the way, faculty and staff line the walkway to cheer for students starting their journey at NMSU. The walk concludes when students pass through the Miller Gates and receive a warm welcome from the Chancellor.

### Senior Walk

Aggies culminate their time at NMSU with the Senior Walk the spring before they graduate. The Senior Walk commences with students walking back through the Miller Gates and proceeding through campus to the Pan American Center, where NMSU holds its graduation festivities. ## MEET THE TEAM - FACULTY FELLOWS!

One way to meet faculty is to visit during their scheduled office hours, which are set times that your professors will be in their office to assist students.
